At this time we're still not sure what the final effect of RFDs will be on our event but one way or another, there will be a Third Annual Bluefin Bonanza. ## **How the Bluefin Bonanza Helps our Community**

The objective of the Casco Bay Bluefin Bonanza is to raise funds, but the goal is to distribute those funds in ways that will build a stronger, healthier and more vibrant community.

#### **Community First**

The Bluefin Bonanza supports our local community in several ways. By hosting a tournament, we provide an opportunity for commercial anglers to fish and sell their catch providing much needed income for fishing families, seafood buyers and retailers. Much of the proceeds from our event are awarded as scholarships to students enrolled in the trades and marine science programs at each of Maine's 7 community colleges. De-

mand for skilled tradesmen and women is increasingly higher but many deserving students lack the means to pay for better education and skills training. By helping them, we're adding more productive individuals to our community's work force.



#### **Caring for the Environment**



The recent proliferation in bluefin tuna stocks is one of the great success stories in fisheries management. Once imperiled and overfished, bluefin tuna populations have recovered, thanks to careful management based on sound research conducted by groups like the Large Pelagics Research Center (LPRC) and the Gulf of Maine Research Institute (GMRI). We

provide financial support to both these organizations. Our contributions to LPRC help pay for their Tag A Tiny program, which uses tags to track migration patterns of young bluefin. Contributions to GMRI support interns in acquiring the necessary

skills and experience to become future researchers. We also support ongoing work on DNA analysis, food habits and movements, all of which contribute to international efforts to ensure this valuable fishery remains healthy and sustainable.

#### **Positive Economic Impact**

The Casco Bay Bluefin Bonanza also provides a significant socio-economic benefit to our local communities. Fishing alone contributes over \$180,000 to the local economy, while also supporting waterfront infrastructure and businesses like marinas, tackle shops, eateries and lodging facilities. Providing scholarship support also helps fill the work force for local businesses and gives graduates an opportunity for higher earnings.

#### The Whole Package

It's impossible to quantify the overall impact that the Casco Bay Bluefin Bonanza has on our community, which not only includes the Casco Bay region, but extends even beyond our State's borders. We provide scholarships to help students improve their position in the workforce. We generate income for our participants as well as an array of local, regional and national businesses. We support the science the scientists who work on valuable research to ensure bluefin stocks remain healthy, and therefore help commercial and recreational fisheries and the seafood industry. None of this would be possible without the support of our sponsors and donors, who understand the importance of community.



#### More Bucks for Your Bluefin

Bluefin tuna can be worth a lot of money, but only when handled properly to maintain quality and appearance. How you handle your fish will influence how much its worth and how willing fish dealers are to buy your catch; and they can easily recognize when fish have been improperly handled. #### Bluefin Tuna...

- ... can raise their body temperature through a specialized blood vessel structure called a countercurrent exchanger that allows them to maintain a body temperature higher than the surrounding water.
- ... can live for 35 years based on current data, though it's been theorized that they could live as long as 50 years.
- ... can reach speeds of 40 miles per hour, thanks to strong core muscles used for power and a streamlined "torpedo" shaped body to reduce water resistance.
- ... can dive to depths of 3,301 feet, where they feed on marine invertebrates like squid and crustaceans.

Tournament scales close at 6:00 p.m. on Saturday, August 7, 2021. All vessels with fish to be weighed must be inside Spring Point Light by 5 p.m. and tied to the scales dock at Spring Point Marina (rafting is acceptable) by 6:00 p.m. Any vessel with a fish to be weighed that is not tied or rafted to the scales dock by 6:00 p.m. will not be accepted (Tournament committee discretion).

#### It's Not Just About Scholarships

Just the fishing during last year's tournament contributed over \$180,000 to the local economy.

- \* Average trip cost (NOAA data): \$823 (includes ice, food, bait, fuel, captain/crew)
- \* 40 boats x 3 trips (days) x \$823 = \$98,760
- \* Average price for bluefin \$6.86/pound
- \* An average landing of 20 fish totaling 9,694 lbs x \$6.86/lb. = \$66,500.84
- \* Registration fee: 40 boats x \$400 = \$16,000

Total = \$181,260.84
